ABOUT COMMUNITY FIRST OXFORDSHIRE

Community First is a **community development charity.** We help communities and individuals to identify issues that affect them and find their own solutions. We support and advise volunteer-led actions in Oxfordshire, helping hundreds of volunteers fulfil many roles in their communities. We support the principles of Asset-based Community Development. We think that stronger, more sustainable communities are built using the skills and gifts that people already have.

Community First offers a **Rural Housing Enabling Service**, funded by Defra via Action with Communities in Rural England. We can support communities who want to deliver affordable housing for their residents, working to identify local housing need, find a suitable site, get a planning permission, and build the home.

As part of our enabling service, in July-August 2024, **Steeple Aston Parish Council** and **Middle Aston Parish Meeting** asked Community First to undertake a parish-wide Housing Needs Survey.

SURVEY AIMS

The aims of the September 2024 Steeple Aston and Middle Aston Housing Needs Survey were to help establish:

- The extent of local affordable housing need in the parish.
- Levels of support for the principle of providing housing for those with local connections to Steeple Aston and Middle Aston.

DISTRIBUTION AND RESPONSE

In order to carry out the Housing Needs Survey, questionnaires and *Freepost* return envelopes (addressed to Community First) were hand-delivered to parish dwellings in July 2024 by local volunteers.

Community First, liaising with the Parish Councils, prepared the structure of the survey. Community First analysed the returned surveys and prepared this report. The survey does not claim to be representative of the entire population of the parish.

The survey responses were analysed in two parts. All respondents were asked to complete Part One of the questionnaire. Part Two was for whole households (or individuals within a household) which need an affordable home and want to stay in Steeple Aston and/ or Middle Aston.

SUMMARY

- Surveys were hand-delivered to 483 households in the parishes, by Parish Council volunteers
- 150 completed surveys were returned a response rate of 31%.
 - 129 of these respondents live in Steeple Aston and 21 live in Middle Aston
- 150 respondents answered the question: 'do you support the principle of providing housing for those in need who have local connections to Steeple Aston?'
 - 78% of respondents said YES
 - o 8% said NO
 - 14% said MAYBE

- 149 respondents answered the question: 'would you support a site being developed in Steeple Aston to provide a small number of homes for those with local connections in housing need?'
 - 71% of respondents said YES
 - 10% said NO
 - 19% said MAYBE
- Steeple Aston has established a Community Land Trust with the intention of delivering community-led homes for local people. 148 respondents answered the question: 'do you support the principle of Steeple Aston and Middle Aston Community Land Trust?'
 - 67% said YES
 - 5% said NO
 - 28% said MAYBE

No information is known about the non-respondents, and no assumption has been made about their needs or requirements.

THE PARISH OF STEEPLE ASTON AND MIDDLE ASTON AND THE LOCAL HOUSING MARKET

Steeple Aston and Middle Aston are adjoining civil parishes within the District of Cherwell. Steeple Aston has a good range of facilities, which include a primary school, shop and post office, a pub, a parish church, and a village hall. It is a strong and vibrant community with regular community events, clubs, and societies.


The parishes are well situated between the towns of Bicester to the west, Banbury to the North, and Oxford to the South. The nearest town is Bicester, which is approximately 7 miles away. Buses run to Banbury and Oxford and the community is also served by a volunteer bus which runs twice a day to nearby Lower Heyford Train station for onward travel to Banbury and Oxford.

House prices in the parish are very high. The majority of sales in Steeple Aston during the last year were detached properties, selling for an average price of £1,514,667. Semi-detached properties sold for an average of £475,000, with terraced properties fetching £332,500.

There is little availability for private rent. At the time of writing, one 3-bed property was available at a rent of £2,850 per month. There is also a limited amount of affordable housing, with approximately 63 (13.2%) homes classified as social housing according to the 2021 Census.

There are too few property transactions to give reliable information for Middle Aston.


1. Do you live in the parish of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 150




2. How many people of each age group live in your household? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 124 (276 INDIVIDUALS)



3. How long have you lived in the parish of Steeple Aston? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 129




4. Who owns the home you live in now? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 129




5. Have any members of your household left the parish of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston in the last 5 years?










Do you support a small development of homes for those in affordable housing need with local connections to the parish of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston?





12. How many people of each age group would live in the new home (include carers if support needed to live independently)?












18. Why does your household need a new home? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 20 (41 TOTAL CHOICES)





20. Does anything affect the type of home you need? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 19




21. What type of home would best meet your needs? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 20 (33 TOTAL CHOICES)




22. Does anyone in your household have a specialist housing need? If so, what type do they require?




23. Which of the following affordable housing options would be best for you? **TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 14 (15 TOTAL CHOICES)**




24. How many bedrooms would your new home need? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 17



25. What is your household's total monthly income before tax (approx. gross income)? **TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 16**




26. If interested in renting or buying a property, can you give us some idea of how much rent/mortgage you would be prepared to pay per month? TOTAL RESPONDENTS = 15












Do you support the principle of providing housing for those in need who have local connections to the parish of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston?


Do you support a small development of homes for those in affordable housing need with local connections to the parish of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston?





SURVEY ANALYSIS

The findings of this report are exclusively based on the March 2024 **Steeple Aston and Middle Aston Housing Needs Survey**.

SUPPORT FOR THE PRINCIPLE OF PROVIDING AFFORDABLE HOUSING

- **78%** of respondents answered **YES to the question** *do you support the principle of providing housing for those in need who have local connections to Steeple Aston or Middle Aston?* 8% said NO. 14% said MAYBE.
- **71%** of respondents answered **YES to the question** *would you support a site being developed in Steeple Aston or Middle Aston to provide a small number of homes for those with local connections in housing need*? 10% said NO. 19% said MAYBE.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDS FINDINGS

Part 2 of the Survey asked households to state if they had a need for the following affordable housing options:

- Rent (e.g. from a Housing Association)
- Shared Ownership (e.g. part-rent/ part-buy)
- Either of the above

NUMBERS IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEED

- 1. 21 households completed Part 2:
 - 20 households had a local connection to Steeple Aston and 1 household had a local connection to Middle Aston.
- 2. 9 households currently own their home:
 - Households which own their own home do not ordinarily meet the qualifying criteria for affordable housing. However, this does demonstrate a need for downsizing homes at market sale value.
- 3. 1 household did not demonstrate a sufficient Local Connection to Steeple Aston or Middle Aston
 - For the purposes of this analysis, local connection has been assessed against the criteria set out in the <u>Cherwell District Council Allocations Scheme</u>. This states that priority will be given to applicants who are in housing need and:
 - have lived in the village for the last five years or
 - are employed in the village for a minimum of sixteen hours per week and the employment is not of a short-term nature or
 - have ten years previous residence in the village if not currently residing there or
 - are over 55 or with a disability requiring support on health grounds from close relatives currently living in the village or
 - have close relatives (as defined at section 3.6.2.3) living in the village for a period of at least the last five years.

Taking into account 1-3 above, 11 HOUSEHOLDS have been included in the detailed summaries of affordable housing needs set out below.

SUMMARY OF IDENTIFIED NEED - RENTED HOUSING

- 3 households chose rented accommodation exclusively in their tenure choices.
- 2 households which chose 'any tenure' and are potentially UNLIKELY to afford a mortgage or • deposit (based on estimates from the financial information provided) have been included in the final tally for rented accommodation.
- Depending on circumstances, there may be restrictions on the number of bedrooms a • household requiring rented accommodation is eligible for. Therefore, the likely eligible number of bedrooms based on information supplied has been estimated rather than the number identified by the responder.
- EXPLANATORY NOTE MORTGAGE DEPOSIT AFFORDABILITY: A search of properties sold in Steeple Aston in the last year was conducted on Right Move in September 2024. SUGGESTED NEXT STEPS

The findings of this report are exclusively based on the September Steeple Aston and Middle Aston Housing Needs Survey. A level of affordable housing need has been identified from households responding to the survey.

Important note: the needs breakdown is indicative. In addition, and if applicable, a household's needs would require full analysis through a Homeseeker (Housing Register) application to Cherwell District Council.

The report is intended to help inform discussions regarding the affordable housing mix on any potential future housing developments in Steeple Aston. These discussions will also be informed by, for example, additional housing need as currently evidenced from Cherwell District Council Homeseeker.
